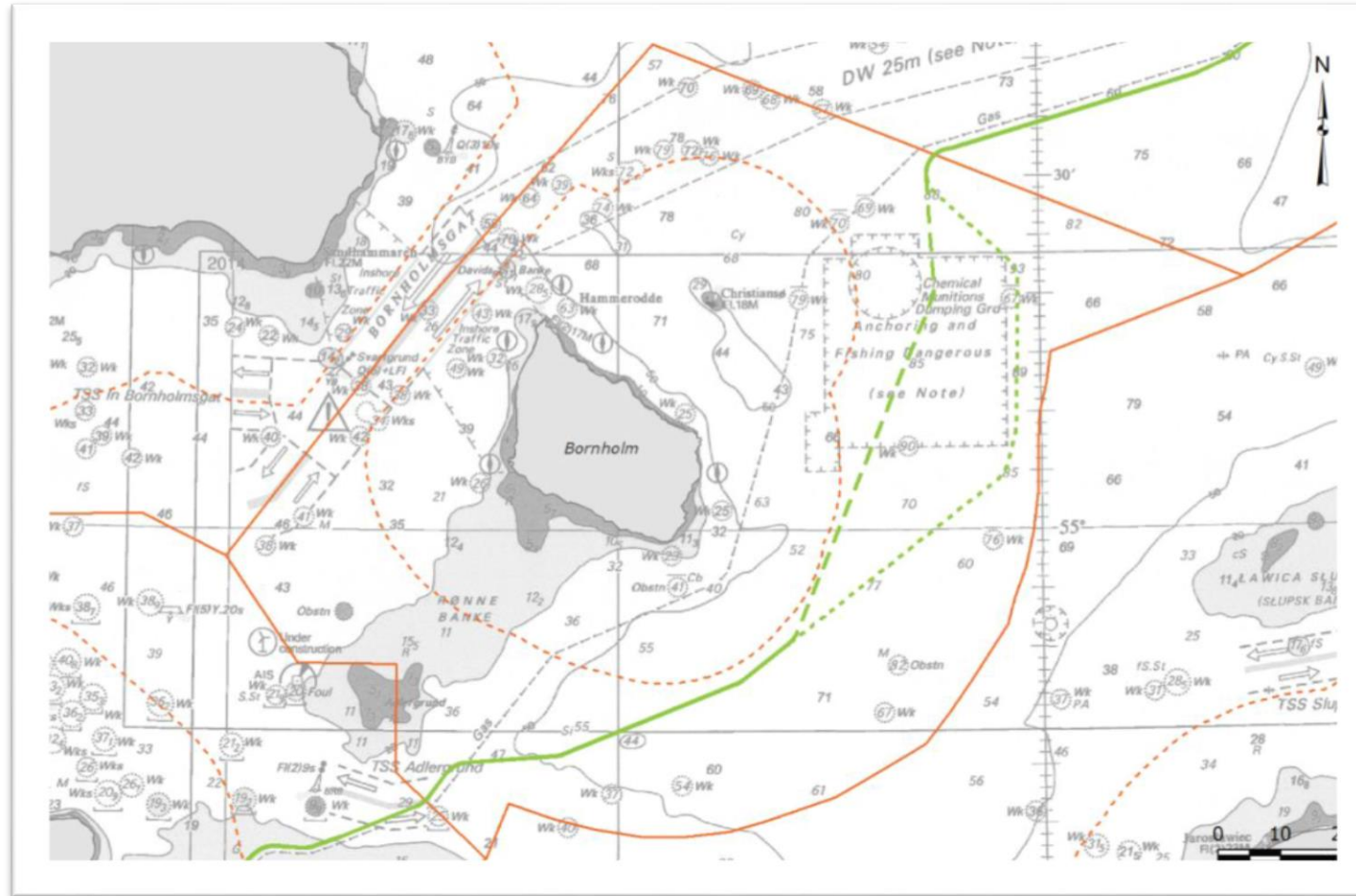

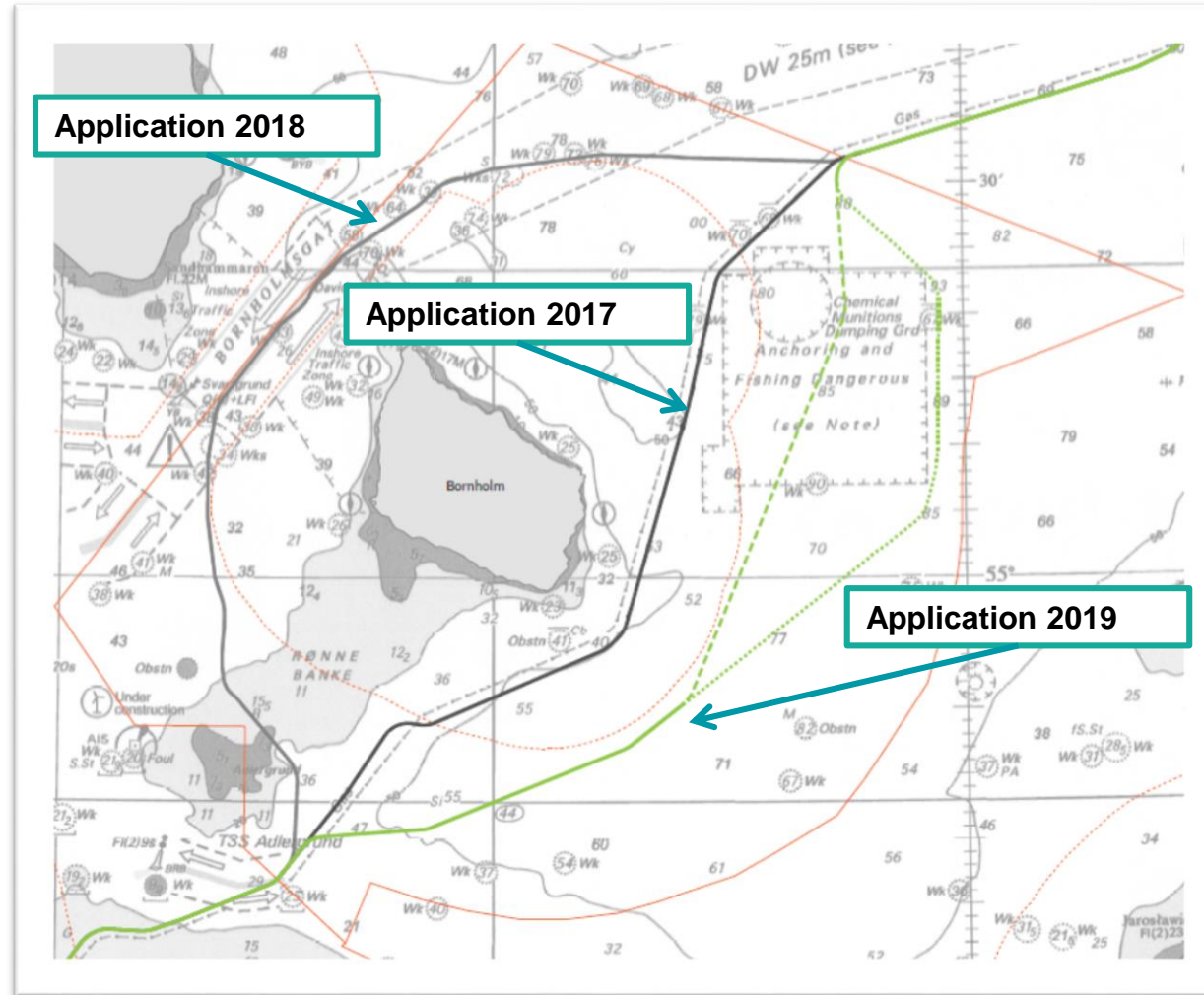

# Legislation

Permission to establish pipelines at sea refer under the Ministry of Energy, Utilities and Climate

Permission is granted pursuant to section 4 of the Continental Shelf Act

An assessment of the impact on the environment (EIA) must be made



Prepared by the developer

The EIA-report must:

- Describe and evaluate a project's direct and indirect environmental impact
- Cover impacts both inside and outside the Danish territory

The information in the EIA must include:

- 1) Population and human health,
- 2) biodiversity,
- 3) land, soil, water, air and climate,
- 4) material assets, cultural heritage and landscape and
- 5) the interaction between the factors in no. 1-4.

The EIA-report is now in public consultation and the consultation responses can be sent to the Danish Energy Agency

The finalized EIA-process, can result in:

- Terms of the license
- Minor adjustments of the project
- Terms of environmental monitoring

- 15 April Danish Energy Agency received the application
- 15 May Start of consultation (National and Espoo)
- 19 June Public meeting
- 10 July National consultation expires
- 17 July Espoo-consultation expires
