Kattegat II, spring 2023

Overall impression:

Migration intensity in the area was low. In spring, small flocks of migratory waterbirds, mainly seaducks and dabbling ducks, were recorded regularly. Moreover, small numbers of thrushes and other songbirds were also seen or heard throughout the entire spring period as were single individuals of birds of prey.

Passage of migratory birds during night was detected by the vertical radar but species identification based on calls was not possible due to high flight altitudes. During adverse weather conditions songbirds landed on the vessel, which facilitated species identification.

A summary of the observations conducted during the surveys 23-26 March 2023 and 04-09 May 2023 is presented below.

Species recorded during daytime:

- Commonly spotted species include lesser black-backed gull, common scoter, and black-throated diver.
- Notable sightings include a significant migration of barnacle geese with 6,000 individuals observed on a single morning.
- Other species observed during this period include: Artic skua, razorbill, common eider, long-tailed duck, red-throated diver, northern gannet, starling, lesser black-backed gull, jackdaw, rook, carrion crow, whooper swan, barnacle goose, graylag goose, velvet scoter, sandwich tern, grey heron, common gull, cormorant, shelduck, chiffchaff, barn swallow, red-breasted merganser, unidentified curlew, black headed gull, great cormorant, arctic/common terns, sandwich terns, sanderling, honey buzzard, swift, dunnock, song thrush, herring gull, guillemot, great black-backed gull, hen harrier, kestrel, and sparrow hawk.

Species recorded during nighttime:

- Regularly heard species during nighttime include redwing, mistle thrush, song-thrush, European robin, and reed bunting.
- Other nighttime species include chiff-chaff, skylark, meadow pipit, goldcrest, waders, gulls, common sandpiper, oystercatcher, and barnacle goose.

Additional Notes:

- Small flocks of various migrating bird species were observed during daytime surveys.
- Some nocturnal migration was observed, but several tracks on the radar were either 'silent' or too distant to identify.
- On 05-05-2023, observations were hindered by strong winds and high waves, but clear radar images were obtained due to the absence of rain.

Hesselø Syd, autumn 2023

Overall impression:

Bird migration through the area occurs at a relatively low intensity. Migratory movements are dominated by species of ducks, mainly seaducks but also dabbling ducks, cormorants, gulls and other seabirds. Thrushes and other migratory songbirds were also recorded, as were single individuals of birds of prev.

Passage of migratory birds during night was detected by the vertical radar but species identification based on calls was not possible due to high flight altitudes. During adverse weather conditions songbirds landed on the vessel, which facilitated species identification.

A summary of the observations conducted during the surveys 18-22 August 2023, 08-13 September 2023 and 03-04 October 2023 is presented below.

Species recorded during daytime:

- Commonly spotted species include lesser black-backed gull, common scoter, and wigeon.
- Notable sightings of seabirds include 4 great skuas, 2 fulmars and regular sightings of northern gannets.
- Other species observed during this period include: Red-throated diver, common scoter, velvet scoter, common eider, greater scaup, common guillemot, razorbill, canada goose, brent goose, great cormorant, grey heron, lesser black-backed gull, great black-backed gull, herring gull, kittiwake, sandwich tern, black tern, western marsh harrier, kestrel, merlin, dunlin, red knot, grey plover, golden plover, whimbrel, ruff, feral pigeon, wren, wheatear, white wagtail, yellow wagtail, tree pipit, meadow pipit, icterine warbler, lesser whitethroat, garden warbler, blackcap, willow warbler, chiffchaff, goldcrest, pied flycatcher, redstart, blue tit, greenfinch, brambling, siskin.

Species recorded during nighttime:

- Species heard during nighttime include robin, song thrush, redwing, oystercatcher, common snipe, ringed plover, tree pipit.
- Other nighttime species include herring gull, lesser black-backed gull and grey heron.

Additional Notes:

- Small flocks of migrating passerine species were observed during daytime surveys including flocks of blue tits and siskins.
- Some activity of nocturnal migrants evident on the vertical radar, but most tracks on the radar were either 'silent' or too distant to identify.
